- **ENGS 89/90 West Wheelock Accessibility Project:** [Presentation, Report](#), Q&A (15 min)
 - Engineers stressed the importance of traffic calming, lowering vehicle travel speeds through narrower travel lanes, buffers to separate walking and bicycling from cars, the feasibility of an oval roundabout at W Wheelock and Thayer, about the need for more safe crossings across W Wheelock
 - Bill: Discussed potential need for an elevator in the new dorms being built on West Wheelock
 - Doug: Asked if there is a plan for an elevated bike/walk path through the cemetery. Also brought up that the left turn into old Tuck drive has 8 seconds to turn because of the blind spot.
- **Shared Streets for Hanover** - Presentation Q&A with Carolyn Radisch from Toole Design, tools to create a network of accessible multi-modal streets, areas of concern (50 min)) (list of streets is included on 2nd page of agenda)
 - On the map, red lines indicate primary bike lanes, orange is important but connect to people's homes.
 - Jennie: Hope to provide guidance on where to ride and also include the increase in scooter use in the design plans, especially with high school, middle school, and elementary school students also using more e-scooters and e-bikes



- Hugh + Bill: Town and college have different policies, and it's confusing for every new class of students. Bill also urges consultants to meet with Dartmouth Safety and Security, Joanna Whitcomb, and Dave Anderson.
- Main pain points in discussion: West Wheelock, East Wheelock, South Main to town line, Lyme/Park intersection tricky on a bike, Lebanon street to hospital, North Main, College Street, College and Maynard tricky intersection on a bike, Maple Street should be bike friendly with sidewalks, safer crossings, and not so wide as to encourage unsafe passing, Lyme road by middle school bike lanes deadend into curb
- Solutions: Continuous (raised) Sidewalk intersections, narrower travel lanes, safer intersection design, designing through the intersection for bicyclists, consider roundabouts that allow for safe crossing and traffic calming, shorten crossing distances by eliminating excessive lanes, lane width and extending curbs in ways that don't interfere with bike lanes, intersections that have the majority of pedestrians crossing against the light are not designed for pedestrians and should be redesigned to serve pedestrians, separate modes along high speed or volume corridors, design for walking and bicycling together to avoid creating conflicts and incomplete designs, mark all crossings at intersections with marked crosswalks
- Some specific small spots - daylight North Main intersection at Tuck Drive, consider removing one lane of vehicle traffic along College from the Green to Mayard,
