The Hanover Police Department is authorized to enforce the provisions and/or violations of permits and noise disturbances under the Town ordinances and State Law.

TOWN ORDINANCE SUMMARY

Noise Disturbance: Any sound, whether a continuous sound or an impulse noise, which is a loud or unreasonable noise and which disturbs a reasonable person with normal sensitivities.

PERMIT ALLOWANCE

The noise producing activity will be in compliance with the provisions of all other applicable ordinances and regulations. (2) The noise producing activity will not create an undue hardship for an abutter or the general public

PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION OF ORDINANCES: Unless otherwise stated, any person or unnatural person within the meaning of the Criminal Code, who violates an ordinance shall be guilty of a violation and upon conviction thereof, shall be penalized by a fine of not more than \$300 for the first violation, \$500 for the second violation, and \$1,000.00 for third and subsequent violations thereafter. The owner of a property as so defined on which a noise disturbance occurs shall be held liable for such noise disturbance

STATE LAW

644:2 Disorderly Conduct

(a) Making loud or unreasonable noises in a public place or making loud or unreasonable noises in a private place which can be heard in a public place or other private places, which noises would disturb a person of average sensibilities.
